





When you integrate your systems with ORCID, you can more easily stay up to date with the research that comes from your scholars – while making their lives easier.



Name disambiguation. Have confidence that you have correctly identified contributions from your researchers, regardless of the popularity or variability of their names.



Better research connections. Follow your researchers' careers even after they leave your institution. Keep better track of collaborators and peers at other institutions.



Easier assessment. Effectively track the research that comes from your institution by automatically accessing authoritative trusted publication and funding data from your researchers' ORCID records.



Improved visibility of outputs. Improve the visibility of your researchers' outputs and ensure they get the recognition they deserve by automatically adding authoritative, trusted affiliation data via integration with the ORCID registry.



Reduced administrative burden. Increase both efficiency and quality in critical processes like assessment exercises. Avoid time spent re-entering data during submission, review, and reporting. When your researchers have more time to spend on research, you save money!




Strengthen research Integrity. Improve the trustworthiness of researchers' ORCID records—and contribute to the global community trust model espoused by ORCID—by adding validated data to their records.

The key is in the API Integrations

Goal: An Integrated Research Data Ecosystem

- Better tracking of research outcomes
- Accurate attribution and enhanced discoverability of contributions, awards & awardees, peer reviews & reviewers
- Reduced administrative burden for both staff and researchers
- Alignment with FAIR Data Principles and Open Research practices

The more fully populated, sufficiently complete ORCID records and integrated systems there are, the more value that stakeholders can gain from participating in ORCID. It is our goal to create the conditions to allow this to happen.



ORCID member organizations add validated information

When an ORCID member updates an ORCID record, the “**Source**” (provenance) of that update is captured for re-use:

- Research organizations add affiliations and outputs
- Publishers add outputs and reviews
- Funders add funding items



These provide ‘**trust markers**’ that can be used to help in decision making.







- Facilitate greater re-use of ORCID data by researchers by improving the ability to export record data through integrations and more formatting options (1 comment)
- Meet community expectations by implementing improvements to user account security including change notifications
- Continue to improve our cybersecurity posture through adoption of cloud-hosting best practices, completion of software dependency upgrades and improving incident response processes


In Progress

- Improve resiliency and reliability of our infrastructure
- Increase researcher understanding of ORCID, reduce confusion and encourage active participation
- Better support humanities researchers by extending the work type taxonomy to cover more of their outputs
- Strengthen connections between researchers and their institution by suggesting relevant affiliations to existing users and encouraging users without affiliations to add them
- Update API Tiering model to offer higher rates/better reliability to members and encourage use of the Public API over the anonymous API
